Dale Raymond Frechette passed away peacefully July 25, 2022, with family members at his bedside. He was 67 and had been fighting dementia and ALS the past few years. Born June 3, 1955, Dale was raised in Richmond Heights, Ohio, where he and his wife, Laura, moved recently after raising their three children in Mentor, Ohio. Dale retired from Progressive Insurance in late 2019 after 42 years of service in the I.T. department.
